HOW MITHILA ART ORIGINATED?

Mithila paintings, a cultural treasure with deep roots, have been confined to a specific geographical region for centuries. This exquisite art form has been **passed down through generations**, preserving its beauty and essence.

The origins of Mithila paintings date back to the time of the epic Ramayana when King Janak commissioned artists to adorn the walls during the wedding of his daughter, Sita, to Lord Ram. Traditionally, Mithila painting graced the walls of homes. Over time, the talented women of Mithila extended their artistic expressions to the floors, decorating their houses with these intricate designs.

The turning point in the history of Mithila painting occurred in 1934 when a massive earthquake shook the region. Fast forward to 1960, when a group of members from the All-India Handicrafts Board in Delhi ventured to Mithila for a survey.

What they encountered were the captivating wall paintings of Mithila that had endured the test of time. Inspired by the artistry, they offered suggestions to local artisans to apply their traditional techniques to cloth and paper. Additionally, they provided encouragement to the women of Mithila to explore the commercial potential of Mithila painting or Bhitti Chitra.









The art world was **introduced to Mithila painting in 1934**, thanks to the discovery made after the significant earthquake that struck Bihar. **William G. Archer,** a British colonial officer in the Madhubani District, stumbled upon these remarkable paintings adorning the interior walls of homes while inspecting the damage caused by the earthquake.

Mithila paintings, with their rich history and captivating beauty, have continued to enchant art enthusiasts worldwide. This unique art form, once confined to the walls of Mithila, has evolved into a global symbol of cultural heritage and artistic expression.
